

The Diversity Visa Program (a.k.a. the Visa Lottery)

The Diversity Visa Program gives away 55,000 green cards (and a path to citizenship) annually to winners selected by a computerized lottery.¹

- Natives of any country that has sent fewer than 50,000 immigrants to the United States in the previous five years are eligible; they need only have the equivalent of a high school education or two years of work experience.²
- There are no limits to how many people can enter. Between roughly 5 million and 25 million people apply every year.³
- There is no cost to apply for the lottery. Winners selected by a computerized random drawing pay an application fee of \$330 for the visa and a path to U.S. citizenship.⁴
- Individuals already in the United States on non-immigrant visas are eligible; aliens residing in the U.S. illegally are not eligible.

The visa lottery is a new form of national origins-based discrimination in U.S. immigration policy.

- Eligibility for the lottery is determined by the place of one's birth.
- The lottery was conceived by Irish American lawmakers as a way to grant green cards to illegal aliens from Ireland.⁵

Each lottery winner creates a new potential chain of migration.

- Lottery winners can immediately sponsor their spouse and minor children for green cards through the family preference categories.
- Once they become U.S. citizens, they can sponsor their parents, adult children, and adult siblings for green cards in a potentially never-ending chain.
